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MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Guardians,

What a fantastic Beginning School Mass we had last Friday. It is always great to be able to come together as a whole school community and it was wonderful to see many family members be able to join us for Mass as well as to spend some time with the students during our extended recess. A big thank you to Mrs Parkinson for her organisation of the Mass and to Father McGrath for celebrating it with us.

Last Friday I sent a COMPASS message regarding our uniform and in it I mentioned a phrase of 'doing the little things well'. I wish to reiterate that it is so important for our students to start developing these 'little things' or habits early in the year as it sets them up for great success into the future. Some students find this a challenge at times and that's OK, as we are here to support them along the way. That's where your support is crucial too. We need all students to learn that even if they don't like the rules or expectations that you have for them at home or we have for them at school, that they can't pick and choose what suits them. That's where having consistency and high expectations are really crucial and important. If we teach or model for students that some rules are OK to follow and some others aren't, it creates a level of confusion for them. Being consistent with high expectations will build and develop students levels of resilience to be able to cope with any situation, both positive or challenging, that they may come up against now or as they get older.

A couple of guick reminders that are also in this newsletter. Please do not drop students off at school before 8:30 a.m. as there is **no teacher on duty** until this time. Even a couple of minutes before 8:30 is too early. Also, as I am on duty most mornings before school I have noticed we still have several parents dropping students off along John St near the RSL Park. Please refrain from doing this as it is a dangerous place to be stopping and letting students out. Just like not arriving early, we want everyone to be safe at all times

POSITIVE STUDENT LEARNING BEHAVIOUR & SPARK

During our regular policy reviews last year, we looked at our Positive Student Behaviour Management Policy. Staff, parents via a survey, as well as students provide feed back on what they believed are actions or behaviours that support student learning in a positive way or those that may have a negative impact on learning or others.

Following this, we were able to group and categorise these actions and behaviours into the following themes: Safe behaviours, Positive mindset, Always learning, Respectful actions and Kindness toward others. The initial letters of each of these themes spells the word SPARK which we are using as an overall theme. Your children may have already spoken to you about this.

This term each class, including Music and PE, have been working toward creating their own a set of agreed behaviours and actions for each of these areas that will support student learning. They are creating a series of posters for reference in their rooms. These agreed classroom behaviours will support the school wide expectations we have for all students.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR & SPARK AWARDS



At St Mary's we are focussed on

Safe behaviours: Is making positive choices in the classroom and playground to keep yourself and others safe.



Positive mindset: Is to value all opportunities to learn by having the courage to always have a go.



Always learning: Is understanding you have a right to learn and respecting the right for others to learn.



Respectful actions: Is always acting in ways that respects yourself, each other, all staff and the school community.



Kindness towards others: Is being welcoming and treating others with respect and kindness as Jesus has shown us.

SPARK Awards:

To promote and acknowledge students who are consistently working on these areas to enhance their own learning, while supporting and interacting positively with others, each fortnight there will be a school wide focus on a specific behaviour:

- Weeks 1 & 2: Safe Behaviours
- Weeks 3 & 4: Positive Mindset
- Weeks 5 & 6 Always Learning
- Weeks 7 & 8: Respectful actions
- Weeks 9 & 10: Kindness towards others

At the end of the fortnightly focus, a student from each class will be awarded a SPARK award for the specific positive behaviour focus area, as nominated by their class teacher.

At the end of each term, all SPARK award winners for that term will be invited to participate in a Principal morning tea/lunch or activity.

SCHOOL UNIFORM CLARIFICATION (via COMPASS 10/2/23)

Dear Parents and Guardians.

I just thought I'd send a quick message to everyone as I'm aware there maybe some clarification required regarding our school student uniform policy and in particular, student hair. I have also noticed a couple of other items related to our uniform policy that I would like to remind everyone of too, which I have included below.

Our policy states:

Hair, if below shoulder length, should be tied back. Hair accessories are to be in the school colours - navy, light blue, white or maroon.

This is inclusive for both girls and boys. I have noticed that we are also getting a variety of different coloured hair accessories being worn to school, so if all parents could ensure they are the colours as listed above, that would be appreciated.

Jewellery:

We have noticed some students wearing bracelets to school. Please note these are *not* to be worn as part our school uniform. Any form of nail polish is also not permitted to be worn at school.

Socks:

A reminder that all socks, whether they are blue (girls), grey (boys) or white, **must be plain** with no visible logos or brands on them.

I speak to the students about ensuring they do the 'little things well'. These 'little things' include being respectful to others (both students and adults), always using their manners, making sure they on time by answering bells promptly, being organised and ready to learn everyday and following all our school rules and expectations. One of these expectations is for students to be in correct school uniform at all time.

Setting up good habits for all aspects of learning and school are important for all students at the start of each year. We appreciate all your support in helping the students in these areas as well.

I do understand that from time to time there may be a reason that students are out of uniform, if this is the case, a note must be sent with the student to be given to the class teacher that morning.

Would you like your child to be part of the 2023 NSW Premier's Reading Challenge?

The Challenge commences on **February 27th, 2023**. There is no cost involved to participate. The Challenge aims to encourage a love of reading for leisure and pleasure in students, and to enable them to experience quality literature. It is not a competition but a challenge to each student to read, to read more and to read more widely.

The Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) is open to all NSW students in Kindergarten to Year 9, in government, independent, Catholic and home schools.

Children can have books read to them, shared reading by parent and child or reading independently. Current 2023 Recommended Reading Booklists of quality literature and age recommendations are provided as part of this challenge and are a very useful resource if you are wondering "What books are good books for my child to be reading? - catering for a range of interests, ages and variations in reading ability. <u>NSW Premier's Reading Challenge 2023: Booklist</u> Home

Your child will receive a special certificate to acknowledge each year of participation in the Challenge. It is very rewarding to see a child's ongoing commitment to reading rewarded with a special Gold Certificate after 4 years, a Platinum award after 7 years and a very special award at the end of Year 9.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING DIOCESAN SPORTS TRIALS - from the CEDWW Sports Team

Diocesan sports trials are mainly for Year 6 students and some Year 5 students who show a high standard of skill and sportsmanship for the chosen sport, however, if there is an exceptional younger student they may be considered.

Each school in the Diocese is restricted to a certain number of students for each sport, so a school trial may have to be held if we have too many names. We are normally permitted 4 spaces for each boys and girls event. Preference may also be given to Year 6 students if we have too many nominations. Once we have finalised the nimations at school, **parents are responsible for registering their student** via the https://csnsw.sport/ website

To be eligible, students **MUST** have an out of school commitment to **participation in the chosen sport.** If your child chooses to nominate for a trial and is selected, we will give you further information on the registration process. Parents are responsible for transporting your student to the trial and any associated costs as part of the Diocesan trials process.
