YEAR 3 NEWS

- Please continue to encourage your children to read for 20 minutes and learn their words each night, along with the multiplication facts of the month. We will be working on the 5X tables during March.

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NAPLAN - YEAR 3 & YEAR 5 STUDENTS

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a point in time assessment of literacy and numeracy skills. Each year students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in tests for writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

From 2023, NAPLAN is moving to Term 1 and will take place from Wednesday 15 March to Monday 27 March. The reason for this change is so that results can be returned to schools earlier in the year which will support teachers to understand the learning needs of their students and plan accordingly.

NAPLAN tests are just one part of our school learning assessment program and questions are primarily based on knowledge, understanding and skills gained from the prior year of schooling.

In preparation for NAPLAN 2023, our school will undertake activities to help students to become familiar with the format and functionality of the online tests. These activities are not an assessment of student ability and will not be marked.

Excessive preparation for NAPLAN is not required nor recommended.

43RD ANNUAL COROWA SWIM-IN & MILITARY VEHICLE GATHERING

The students at St Mary's have been invited to attend the 43rd Annual Corowa Swim-In & Military Vehicle Gathering which is taking place next week.

As part of this experience, the students involved will walk to Ball Park to experience:

- A demonstration of an amphibious vehicles entering and exiting the river;
- A variety of different military vehicles to investigate and explore;
- Hands on experiences with a variety of items such as helmets, uniforms etc.

Given the combination of the walk and being near the river to watch the demonstration, it has been decided **that only students from Years 2 to Year 6 will attend this event.** There will be one group attending a morning session while the other group will attend an afternoon session.

SECOND WEEK OF LENT (Week beginning 6th March)



This week through Project Compassion we learn about Tereesa, a Gamilaroi woman from Western Sydney who struggled with homelessness while raising her four children. At just 16 years old, she had to leave school after falling pregnant with her first child. A single mother struggling with homelessness, Tereesa's onlyconcern was finding stability for her children.

Seeking a better future for her family, Tereesa joined Baabayn Aboriginal Corporation's Young Mums and Bubs Group, supported by Caritas Australia. Baabayn helped Tereesa access housing and psychological support. Through Baabayn, Tereesa was also able to hear stories from Indigenous Elders and reconnect with her culture.

Today, Tereesa is studying a certificate in Community Services so that she can strengthen her skills and give back to her community. Tereesa now works at Baabayn, providing support to young mothers and mentoring the next generation of young people.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING DIOCESAN SPORTS TRIALS - from the CEDWW Sports Team

Diocesan sports trials are mainly for Year 6 students and some Year 5 students who show a high standard of skill and sportsmanship for the chosen sport, however, if there is an exceptional younger student they may be considered.

Each school in the Diocese is restricted to a certain number of students for each sport, so a school trial may have to be held if we have too many names. We are normally permitted 4 spaces for each boys and girls event. Preference may also be given to Year 6 students if we have too many nominations. Once we have finalised the nimations at school, **parents are responsible for registering their student** via the **https://csnsw.sport**/ website

To be eligible, students **MUST** have an out of school commitment to **participation in the chosen sport**. If your child chooses to nominate for a trial and is selected, we will give you further information on the registration process. Parents are responsible for transporting your student to the trial and any associated costs as part of the Diocesan trials process.
